

Teen Summer Camp – Shaping Found Connections
June 22 – 26, 2020

MONDAY	Suminigashi paper marbling technique: create beautiful floating ink designs on water that transfer to paper like magic.
TUESDAY	Suminigashi collage-making: using the marbled paper from Monday, you will create a series of collages with a variety of art materials and found paper.
WEDNESDAY	Plaster self-portrait: Sculpt in clay to create a reverse self-image with added found objects. The result is an abstract cast plaster self-portrait 😊 Studio Visit with a guest artist!
THURSDAY	Found object box installation: using common, everyday objects, you will create a “small world” installation inspired by the work of artist Sarah Sze.
FRIDAY	Final day to finish up working and camp critique!

Materials List

Suminigashi collage project:

- Sumi ink
- 2 calligraphy brushes
- White plastic tub
- Cups for ink and water
- Dish soap
- Thick paper
- White poster board or Bristol paper
- Magazines or old books to cut up
- Scissors, pen knife,
- Glue stick and/or Modge Podge
- Pencils, markers, crayons, favorite drawing material, etc.
- Ruler, stencils, squares, triangles, shape templates, decorative tape, etc. (optional)

Plaster portrait:

- Small-ish cardboard box with a depth of at least 5 inches. (A rectangular box approximately 5" x 12" x 8" would work great.)
- Clay
- Plaster
- 2 flexible plastic buckets
- Clay tools
- Duct tape
- Small found objects

Found object box installation:

- Cardboard box as a "space" to build inside - no larger than 12" x 12" x 12"
- Large piece of sturdy cardboard, Styrofoam or plywood for a base (optional)
- Hot glue gun and white school glue
- Box cutter, Exacto knife, scissors, cutting mat or cardboard to use as a table protector
- Found objects of common use: packing materials, cardboard, toothpicks, Q-tips, food packets, small empty containers, paper, string, wire, rocks, shells, feathers, leaves, bubble wrap, tape of all types, thread, tiles, fans, lights, paper clips, bulldog clips, thumb tacks, plastic parts, plastic silverware, beads, candies, straws, stickers, pipe cleaners, plastic wrap, aluminum foil,.....anything with a use that you find interesting!

- (Optional) Found images or printed photos
- (Optional) Living matter - small house plants, moss, grass, etc.
